

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your kindergartner, \_\_\_\_\_ is learning the sounds of letters in the alphabet. For example, B sounds like /b/ and C sounds like /k/. Circled below are the letter sounds he/she needs to practice at home:

A B C D E F G H I J K L M  
N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z  
a b c d e f g h i j k l m  
n o p q r s t u v w x y z

Choose one letter to practice at a time. Make it fun!

- Letters written like /x/ mean to say the sound of the letter not the name of the letter.
- Listen for the sound in familiar words: “Dog has the /d/ sound at the beginning.”
- Point out the sounds in words you read: “Stop has the /p/ sound at the end.”
- Make up silly songs about the letter and its sound: “B is for bellies, balloons, and bats, B is for bunnies and B is for baths.”
- Write the letters in sand or dirt and say the sound of the letters while writing.
- Serve alphabet foods (ABC noodles, ABC pretzels, ABC cereal, etc.) and ask your child to find the letter that makes a certain sound.
